READING TOGETHER

Reading with your child can support language development, cognitive skills, emotional understanding, and strengthen the bond between you.

Try this:

- Look at the cover and ask what your child thinks the story is about.
- Read the story together.
- Ask your child which part they enjoyed most and why.

QUESTIONING UNDERSTANDING

Once you have shared the story, you can begin asking questions to encourage your child to make connections and think about what they have read. Use the illustrations as prompts and, if needed, turn back to the relevant page to help them find the answer.

Try these:

- Why did the dragon have no teeth?
- Who helped the dragon get new teeth?
- Why didn't the King help the Princess?

DO SOME ROLE PLAY

Role play encourages creativity, imagination, communication, and confidence while helping children explore the story in a fun and engaging way.

Try this:

- Choose a character from the story.
- Decide who will be the Dragon, Princess, or another character.
- Act out your favourite scene together.
- Recreate the story from beginning to end.
- Make up a new adventure for the Dragon.

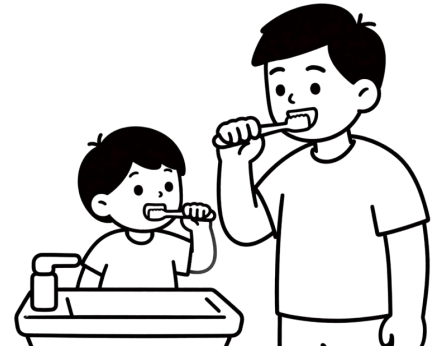
CREATE AND DESIGN

Creating and designing encourages creativity, imagination, and self-expression while helping children engage with the story in their own way.

Try this:

- Draw your favourite scene or character and colour it in.

BRUSH TEETH TOGETHER

Brushing your teeth together helps children build positive habits and understand the importance of looking after their teeth.

Try this:

- Brush your teeth together for two minutes.
- Practise brushing in small circles.
- Talk about why teeth are important.

MAKE HEALTHY DRAGON KEBABS



Creating healthy snacks together is a fun way to continue the story beyond the book. Using fruits such as strawberries, grapes, melon, pineapple and blueberries, children can create their own Healthy Dragon Kebabs while practising their counting skills.

Try this:

- Add lots of different fruits to your skewers.
- For every skewer, add one dragon tooth (marshmallow)
- Count how many dragon teeth you use.
- Count how many pieces of fruit are on your skewer
